Will you take time today to show God how thankful you are to Him? Friday, November 29th (I took time to pray today \square) Read: Luke 2:10 The angel said to the shepherds "Do not be afraid,...I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people." Questions: Does this Scripture remind you that the announcement that Jesus was coming was something special? Does it bring back the reminder that this was a good thing for the people then and for us today? Saturday, November 30th (I took time to pray today \square) Read: Mark 10:45 The Son of man did not come to be served but to serve and give His life a ransom for many. Questions: Do you fully comprehend that Jesus came and gave His life for You too? What does this mean to you and for you?
