Sunday, May 10th (I took time to pray today 
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**Read: John 14:1-14** This Scripture says that Jesus is going to prepare a place for us. Also the well known Scripture of Jesus saying "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

**Questions:** Are you beginning to understand Jesus' role in our salvation? Does this change anything for you and how you address Jesus?

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**Read:** Acts 7:55-60 This Scripture is when Stephen is soon to be stoned and claims as he looks up to heaven that he saw Jesus standing at the right hand of the Father.

**Questions:** Do you see this Scripture as further proof that Jesus rose from the dead and sits at the right hand of the Father? How does that change things for you?

**Read: Psalm 31:1-5** David says in this Psalm that the Lord is his refuge and asks to be kept from the trap that is set for him.

**Questions:** Have you seen the Lord as your refuge? Do you trust that He will keep you safe? Have you been asking for His protection in these times?

Wednesday, May 13th (I took time to pray today  $\Box$ )

**Read: Psalm 15—16** Psalm 15 talks about the blameless character of God and Psalm 16 talks about David's satisfaction with God.

**Questions:** Can you put into words how you have seen God Work in your life? Have you considered sharing this with others? Will you do this?

Thursday, May 14th (I took time to pray today  $\Box$ )

**Read: 1 Peter 2:2-10** This Scripture talks about discriminating between the rich and the poor and the benefits of being poor.

**Questions:** Do you usually show favoritism? How do you do at loving your neighbor?

Friday, May 15th (I took time to pray today 
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**Read: John 14:12** "Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these because I am going to the Father."

**Questions:** Don't you love the idea of this Scripture verse? What greater things would you love to do in Jesus' name?

Saturday, May 16th

**Read:** Matthew 20:26-28 This Scripture reminds us "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant and whoever wants to be first must be your slave."

**Questions:** How well do you do at being a servant or a slave? Do you think the world looks at this differently than us? How can we show the world that we are different?
