Study Guide

May 31, 2020

Sunday, May 31st

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: Acts 2:1-21 This Scripture is about what is expected on what is called Pentecost Sunday. It is the story of the Disciples being in the upper room and tongues of fire (the Spirit) descending upon them.

Questions: Do you think the Holy Spirit can do amazing things in your life, like He did in this story of Acts? Are you willing to ask Him to do this or would this overwhelm you?

Monday, June 1st

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: Numbers 11:24-30 This Scripture describes how in Moses' time, the Spirit descended upon seventy elders and they went out to prophesy.

Questions: Do you consider yesterday's Scripture and today Scriptures about jealousy too? Do you see in both stories that there were people who complained when prophesy occurred?

Tuesday, June 2nd

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: Psalm 104:24-34, 35b This Scripture talks about the greatness of God and also refers to the Spirit.

Questions: Do you think it is important to look at God as Father and the relationship with the Spirit? Why does the Psalmist refer to the Spirit in this Psalm? Can you see what the Spirit does as compared to who the Father is in this Psalm?

Wednesday, June 3rd

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-13 In this Scripture, Paul points out how the Spirit works in us.

Questions: How do you feel knowing what the Holy Spirit gives out to God's children? Is their one gift you would want that you don't have? Do you believe you can ask for a particular gift and you will receive it?

Thursday, June 4th

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: Acts 2:1-21 This Scripture is again the story of Pentecost.

Questions: As you read this again, did anything new come to mind? After all the readings before this, can you say you recognize the Holy Spirit in your life?

Friday, June 5th

(I took time to pray today □)

Read: John 20:19-23 This Scripture shows Jesus' return to His Disciples after His death and that He breathed on them to receive the Holy Spirit.

Questions: Do you see this is different then Pentecost in that Jesus appeared Himself to them and breathed the Holy Spirit on them? Did you think about how maybe we may need the breath of the Holy Spirit more than once in our lives?


Saturday, June 6th

Read: John 7:37-39 This Scripture shows Jesus telling the people that those who believed in Him would receive the Holy Spirit at a later time.

Questions: Do you see that this is one promise that Jesus made that you can trust? How will you allow the Holy Spirit to flow through you?
