Sunday, June 21st (I took time to pray today
)

Read: Matthew 10:24-25 "The student is not above the teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for students to be like their teachers, and servants like their masters. If the head of the house has been called Beelzebul, how much more the members of his household!"

Questions: What is Jesus referring to in these verses? Are we expected to suffer like Jesus? How do you feel about this?

Monday, June 22nd (I took time to pray today \Box)

Read: Matthew 10:26-37 This Scripture gives more instructions by Jesus. One that stuck out for me was that we should not be afraid of those who kill the body but the one who can destroy both soul and body.

Questions: Who can destroy both soul and body? Are we doing everything we can to avoid being swayed by him?

Tuesday, June 23rd (I took time to pray today □)

Read: Genesis 21:8-21 This is the story of Sarah wanting to send the slave girl, that Abraham had a child with, away.

Questions: Do you see God's protection even when Hagar gave up? Why do you struggle trusting God in difficult situations?

Wednesday, June 24th (I took time to pray today)

Read: Psalm 86:1-10 This Psalm talks about the trust that David had and asking God to hear his prayer..

Questions: When you pray do you also talk about all the things that God has done and can do? Do you think this is an important part of your prayer life? If so, what will you do about it?

Thursday, June 25th

(I took time to pray today \Box)

Read: Psalm 86:16-17 "Turn to me and have mercy on me; show your strength in behalf of your servant; save me, because I serve you just as my Mother did. Give me a sign of your goodness, that my enemies may see it and be put to shame, for you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me."

Questions: Have you ever asked God for a sign? If not, do you believe He will respond to you asking Him for a sign?

Friday, June 26th

(I took time to pray today \Box)

Read: Romans 6:1b-11 This part of Romans talks about us being dead to sin but alive in Christ.

Questions: How do you feel knowing that we should no longer be slaves to sin? How do you feel knowing that we can be set free from sin?

Saturday, June 27th

(I took time to pray today \Box)

Read: Acts 2:36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

Questions: Do you recognize that Jesus is both Lord and anointed Savior? Are you assured of this? What does this mean for your life?
